STRA EWS1 Meeting on Thursday 12 November at 6pm

EWS1 Meeting on Thursday 12 November at 6pm

- Directors need to be aware of this key document "Building safety advice for building owners, including fire doors" https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/building-safety-advice-for-building-owners-including-fire-doors
- And aware of this Policy paper "Draft Building Safety Bill https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/draft-building-safety-bill
- This is a UK wide issue, and impacts all owners of blocks of flats
- There is legislation in the system, but is not yet law
- There is guidance from the government but it's not mandatory
- RICS, CML and other bodies all have an 'interest' in the process, controlling resources and setting standards
- There are various levels of EWS1 Certification A1,2,3 and B1,2. B2 is problematic as mortgage providers wont lend on this.
- Some mortgages companies require EWS1 certificates, some don't
- Different EWS1 assessors give different/ conflicting advice
- There are a number of different companies who have been used across Shad Thames
- There is lack of clarity of what the rules actually mean in practice
- Not all Managing Agents seem to be across the issues or taking the same approach
- Some blocks have achieved EWS1 certification with no issues
- Some blocks have achieved EWS1 certification, but have additional work to complete
- Costs / quotes vary from a few hundred pounds per flat to significant sums for certification
- EWS1 Certificates are in addition to External Fire Risk Assessments
- Councillor Humaira is working with Southwark Council to look at providing a central contact point regarding this topic, with possibilities for signposting for information and resources
